Advent – a time when God breaks in on us; a time when He disrupts our well-planned, ordered lives; a time of waiting for the stagnant waters of our life to be flushed away and replaced with fresh, streams of living water flowing in and out of us. Yes, it is a season of waiting. Waiting for whom?

When Zechariah went to work that day, taking his turn keeping the incense burning in the holy of holies, he did not expect or even hope to encounter a messenger from God. He was just fulfilling his duty, his call and yet, God had something wonderfilled for him. And he has the nerve to question, "Are you sure that is what God has planned? My wife and I are way past the child bearing thing." And we know what happens next when you question a messenger of God— your words are gone! Zechariah waited nine months before he found his voice again and when he did, what did he do? He praised God!

And Elizabeth, cherishing those first few months alone with the knowledge a child was being knit together in her old, unused womb, waiting for the promised John to be revealed to all. She, too, praises God when the child in her womb jumped at the sound of Mary's voice. And she was filled with the Holy Spirit as was the child she conceived.

I need times of waiting, even when I don't particularly like it. I need time to withdraw, to see my sins for what they are; to seek His voice as He births something within me — a deeper longing for Him, and a full acceptance that I am a child of God. I find myself singing these words from Hillsong's "Who You Say I Am":

Who am I that the highest King would welcome me I was lost but He brought me in Oh, His love for me, Oh, His love for me.

Who the Son sets free
Oh is free indeed
I'm a child of God. Yes Lam.

I am chosen not forsaken
I am who You say I am
You are for me not against me
I am who you say I am.

In my Father's house there's a place for me I am a child of God. Yes, I am!

May you, too, discover you are a beloved child of God. And together we will build up the Kingdom of God. But first we wait; after all it is Advent.
